City Introduces Internet Mapping Site


On September 19, the City of Auburn's Information Technology Department-GIS Division will unveil an Internet mapping site that will allow citizens to utilize the City's geographic data covering the City and surrounding area. The site was created entirely by City staff and is available to anyone with an Internet connection. The City of



Auburn's Internet Mapping Site (IMS) will provide a service to the community by enabling Auburn citizens to get important information without having to call or visit City Hall. Citizens may access the IMS from a link on the City's webpage (www.auburnalabama.org/gis) beginning September 19.

Citizens will be able to view, search, and print maps of data consisting of street addresses, zoning information, voting locations, voting wards, City buildings, City property, Environmental Services routes, parks, green space, water features, flood plains, topography, and color aerial photography. Other features on the IMS include the ability to view City limits, annexations, school zones, apartment complexes, mobile home parks, Auburn University property, land use, streets, railroads, bike paths, cell towers, bill-boards, and structures.

Citizens will be able to find any address in the City by simply typing an address number and street name into a text box and clicking on the Go button; the search request will respond by locating users directly over the desired area where they will then be able to pan or zoom around at their leisure. Other search features include the ability to search by street name, parcel, or subdivision. The purpose of this IMS is to provide a service to the citizens of Auburn by sharing dynamic geographic data through a simplified graphical user interface over the Internet. The site also includes a special help section to aid in the use of the customized tools and functionality of the site.

The GIS site will enable citizens to see which school their neighborhood is zoned for as demonstrated in the photo above.

The IMS has been an on-going project for the City's Information Technology Department for a number of months. The site is dynamic and will continually expand to include additional information. The Information Technology Department's GIS Division received a Special Achievement in GIS award in 2004 from ESRI, the world leader in GIS software. The award is given at ESRI's International User Conference and recognizes GIS personnel around the world for their outstanding work in the GIS field. The City of Auburn's GIS Division was one of 150 chosen from among the more than 100,000 ESRI GIS implementations

Help Keep Wildlife **Away From Your Home**

The City of Auburn's Environmental Services Department and its Animal Control Division work to keep Auburn citizens safe from wildlife such as foxes and covotes in residential areas. Citizens can take steps to ensure their safety and the safety of their families in a number of ways, including eliminating food and shelter sources for the animals. The Animal Control Division suggests the following steps to help keep wildlife away from your home:

- Leave pet food and water dishes indoors, especially at night.
- Securely fasten all garbage containers.
- Keep garage doors closed.
- Never feed squirrels, raccoons, or other species that may become a problem.

Citizens should never attempt to interact with or remove wildlife from any area. If you are experiencing problems with these animals in your neighborhood, contact the Animal Control Division immediately at 501-3090 or call 501-3100


