Veterans Day 2014

You are invited to attend the City of Auburn's Veterans Day ceremony to be held at the Auburn Veterans Memorial at the corner of Ross Street and Glenn Avenue beginning at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, November 11. The event will include a wreath laying along with performances by the Auburn University Choir directed by Dr. William Powell, the Drake Middle School Choir directed by Chris Deason and music from bagpiper Dan Drummond. Auburn Mayor Bill Ham, Jr. will officiate. Immediately following the ceremony, a reception will be held at the Auburn Chamber of Commerce, located at 714 East Glenn Avenue.

Attendees are encouraged to park at Felton-Little Park, 341 East Glenn Avenue or at the Douglas J. Watson Municipal Complex, 171 North Ross Street. Parking for the disabled will be available on Ross Street between Glenn Avenue and Harper Avenue. In the event of inclement weather, the ceremony will be held in the City Council Chambers, 141 North Ross Street.

A key component of the park are the brick pavers in honor of individual veterans with ties to members of our community. New bricks are installed in time for the Veterans Day ceremony each year. If you would like to honor a loved one who served, bricks are available to purchase now to be installed in time for Veterans Day 2015. 

Public Safety services, including Police, Fire, and Communications, will remain on their regular schedules during the holidays. The collection of garbage, trash, and recycling during the week of Thanksgiving will change as follows:

Collection carts and recycled materials must be placed on the curb by 6 a.m. on your scheduled collection day. Please avoid placing items on or near storm drains, mailboxes, utility poles, or other fixed objects. All items should be properly contained or bundled so they do not fall into the street or down storm drains. All carts and collection bins must be removed from the curb by 6:00 a.m. the following day.

Auburn Police Introduce New Patrol Vehicle

Auburn residents may have noticed new police vehicles recently patrolling Auburn streets. With previous police car models being phased out by manufacturers, Auburn Police Division (APD) researched a number of vehicle options to find the best choice for patrol vehicles. APD evaluated available vehicle choices based on cost, fuel efficiency and performance. Additionally, APD staff consulted with a number of law enforcement agencies on the cost-benefit of the various police vehicles available. The best balance of all of these factors was found in the Ford Utility Police Interceptor.

The Ford vehicle is about \$1,000 less expensive than the Caprice model vehicle it replaces, offers more room for officers with bulky gear and has a rated fuel mileage comparable with other pursuit class vehicles. Several patrol vehicles must be replaced each year, due to the wear and tear these vehicles see. Vehicle replacement is determined by vehicle age, mileage and frequency and cost of repairs to the vehicle. The average lifespan of a police vehicle is typically around 5-years and 100,000 miles.


Travel with Care

This fall brought not only a new school year and football season, but a new Travel with Care campaign for 2014. Travel with Care is an annual transportation safety awareness campaign presented by the City of Auburn, Auburn University and the Lee County Sherriff's Office.

The 2014 campaign focused on eliminating cell phone distractions not only for drivers, but for cyclists and pedestrians, too. The hazards of biking or driving while using a cell phone are obvious, but distracted pedestrians can walk into moving traffic, trip or step off of curbs, steps or walls or walk into stationary objects. In this year's campaign, pedestrians were encouraged to limit cell phone use and to use ear buds only in one ear so that they can hear what's going on around them, including warnings from cyclists.

Another campaign focus was on nighttime visibility. Cyclists, walkers and joggers are required by law to wear reflective material from one-half hour before sunset to one-half hour before sunrise, and any time when there's not sufficient light to be seen from at least 500 feet away. Reflective material should be worn between the waist and shoulders on the front and back and should be visible from at least 500 feet away. Bicycles must have an operating headlight and reflectors on the front and rear spokes of the wheels and pedals. These regulations and the penalties for breaking them can be found in Section 13-11 of the Code of the City of Auburn (https://www.auburnalabma.org/code).

The campaign's goal is to raise awareness of transportation safety issues, educate drivers, cyclists and pedestrians on transportation rules and regulations and encourage smart, safe and courteous behavior as we share the roads, bike paths and sidewalks in Lee County.
